1st Class Grand Café Restaurant in Amsterdam's historic Central Station



The Four-Season private dining room in the 1st Class Grand Café Restaurant located in Amsterdam's historic Central Station is this year's setting for the GL Conference Dinner and GreyNet Award Presentations. Architect Pierre Cuypers designed this unique

rail station, which opened in 1889. Inspired by Late Gothic and Early Renaissance architecture, Cuypers also designed the Rijksmuseum. The museum was earlier referred to as the 'Bishop's palace' and the train station was its 'cathedral'. For the design and interior, the architect opted for giant arched windows and an inspiring array of details. His drawings and colorful designs are packed with symbolic depictions and references to shipping, railway traffic, industry, as well as science and technology. 




