Her involvement with GreyNet International and her content contributions in the International Conference Series on Grey Literature over the past five years are significant. Her work and that of her colleagues in the Aquatic Sciences and Fisheries in African and Asian countries involving grey literature demonstrate marked achievements in this field of information.

Tamsin Vicary works for the Aquatic Sciences and Fisheries Abstracts (ASFA) Secretariat, based at

Prior to joining ASFA, Tamsin was Collections Manager at the Freshwater Biological Association, and also has experience in the private sector having worked for an international law firm and professional services firm. 
June 13th-14th, 2024






