Those submitting poster abstracts will receive verification upon their receipt followed by further guidelines for posters, conference registration, etc.

Poster Presentations

Your digital conference poster, its abstract and metadata along with your MP4 pre-recorded poster presentation will be published and openly accessible on December 5th 2022 via the <u>TIB AV-Portal</u>. GreyNet Award Speech 2022

Honoring Margret Plank

Head Competence Center for Non-Textual Materials German National Library of Science and Technology

Ladies and Gentlemen, Colleagues,

Seven years ago, Margret Plank first presented at the 17th International Conference on Grey Literature. Her research dealt with non-textual, digital assets. At the 19th GL-Conference she returned together with colleagues in her department with a presentation and conference poster entitled "Video is the New Grey", which won the poster prize that year and which was further elaborated in a full text conference paper and journal article.

In 2017, the German National Library of Science and Technology in Hannover took on GreyNet Associate Membership owing to Margret and her team's involvement in grey literature. Since then, Margret is a standing member of the GL Program Committee. Early on in this capacity, she proposed a media partnership with GreyNet in which all of the annual conference presentations would be assigned a DOI and archived in the TIB AV-Portal. Now, five years on – celebrating its first lustrum – GreyNet's Collection in this media portal accounts for over 75 video presentations.

Margret on behalf of TIB is likewise a representative on GreyNet's Resource Policy Committee in which its full text, research data, and audio-visual materials are managed, linked, and made openly accessible in a FAIR environment. Following upon Margret's recommendation that DOIs be assigned GreyNet's Conference Papers, GreyNet applied for and became a DOI Minting Service via the TU Delft-DataCite Consortia. This DOI Project took a retrospective approach thanks to the efforts of the Technical Developer and System Manager of the GreyGuide Repository. Currently, GreyNet's complete collection of over 450 conference papers have each been assigned a DOI.

In 2019, again owing to Margret's intervention, the 21st International Conference on Grey Literature was hosted by the German National Library of Science and Technology in Hannover. This conference is not only remembered for its content contribution, but due to the worldwide COVID epidemic, it was the last onsite event in this series, which has since been held online. It is intended that next year's 25th Conference in the GL-Series will once again return onsite.

This year, as GreyNet celebrates its 30th Anniversary, our community of practice will have the benefit of a presentation by Margret Plank at the 24th International Conference on Grey Literature in which she addresses innovative services for non-textual materials.

Ladies and Gentlemen, it is indeed a privilege to present the GreyNet Award 2022 to our well-deserved and esteemed colleague, Margret Plank.

Editor's Note

This issue of The Grey Journal celebrates the fifth year in which data papers are included in this serial publication. Data papers mark for GreyNet a forward development in its Enhanced Publication Program. By linking published research data with a detailed technical description of the dataset, a valuable resource is created. The published data paper serves in a way as a tool in implementing FAIR data principles. It increases the findability of research data, making it more accessible. Via its rich metadata and actionable persistent identifiers, it improves interoperability. And, by way of its publication, it offers greater potential for reuse by way of citation and shared open data.

Since the publication of the first data paper in The Grey Journal, there have been two updated versions of GreyNet's data paper template. This is made available to authors and researchers to facilitate and standardize their work of compilation and text writing. In this issue of TGJ, GreyNet's current collection of data papers appears (re)published in accordance with the latest version of the template.

Statistics to date demonstrate that research datasets accompanied by a data paper can account for up to three times as many downloads than datasets not accompanied by a data paper. In fine, data papers have come to extend GreyNet's document trail and has been added to the accepted list of grey literature document types. The data paper, rich in linked metadata via its actionable persistent identifiers, demonstrates the value PIDS provide grey literature and likewise offer a unique resource for training and education in this field of information. https://greynet.org/images/TGJ_TOC_V18_N3.pdf



National Library of Technology

National Library of Technology (hereafter referred to as "NTK") is a central professional library open to public, which offers a unique collection of 250 thousand publications freely accessible in open circulation. Its holdings form the largest collection of Czech and foreign documents from technology and applied natural sciences as well as associated social sciences. It contains a total of 1,2 Mil. volumes of books, journals and newspapers, theses, reports, standards, and trade literature in both printed and electronic forms. Besides its own collection, parts of Central Library of the CTU in Prague and Central Library of the ICT holdings are accessible in NTK.
