Guidelines for Abstracts

Participants seeking to present a paper dealing with a topic on publishing grey literature are invited to submit an English language abstract between 200-400 words. The abstract should introduce the topic, method of approach, and (anticipated) results of the work in progress, work package, or ongoing operations. The abstract should likewise include the title of the proposed paper, topic(s) most suited to the paper, name(s) of the author(s), and full address information. Abstracts are the only tangible source that allows the Program Committee to guarantee the content and balance in the program. Every effort should be made to reflect the content of your work in the abstract submitted. Abstracts not in compliance with the guidelines will be returned to the author for revision.
